Subject- Schools subjecting children to corporal punishment and discrimination du festivals\_reg.

Madam/Sir,

The National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR) (herein referred to as 'the Commission') is a statutory body constituted under Section 3 of Commission for Protection of Child Rights (CPCR) Act, 2005 to protect the rights of chi and address other related matters in the Country. The Commission is further mandat monitor the proper and effective implementation of Protection of Children from S Offences (POCSO) Act, 2012; Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, and Right to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2009.

- 2. Over the years, it has been observed by the Commission through various news re that children are subject to harassment and discrimination by the school teachers and staff on account of celebration of festivals. It has been noticed that schools do not children to wear *rakhi* or *tilak* or *mehandi* in schools during the festival of *Raksha Ban* and subject them to harassment, both physical and mental. It may be noted that cor punishment is prohibited in schools under Section 17 of the RTE Act, 2009.
- Therefore, it is requested to issue necessary directions to the concerned authorand ensure that schools do not observe any such practice that may expose children to corpunishment or discrimination.
