<u>ORDER</u> 16.10.2023

1. A counter affidavit has been filed by the Reserve Bank of India ["RBI"] elucidating the regulatory mechanism in place for cross-border wire transfers. Learned counsel for RBI further states that no specific instance of such transactions using RTGS, NEFT, IMPS etc., which are instruments for domestic transfers, has been disclosed in the petition. Petitioner is permitted to file an affidavit highlighting the instances of international money transfers through the aforesaid modes, as alleged by him, within four weeks from today.
